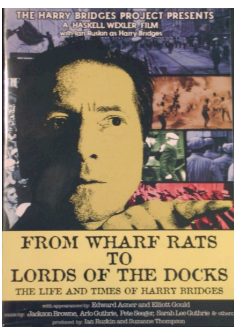

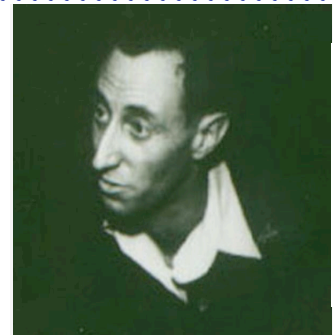
The Sam Kagel film "To Make a Long Story Short" is finally in the final stages of post-production! We'll announce screenings soon.
